

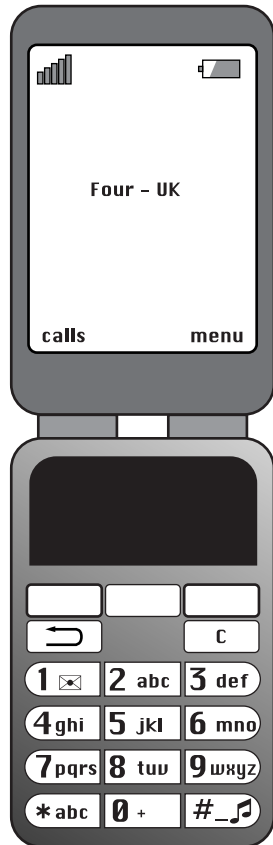
# What to do...

6. Give five different examples.

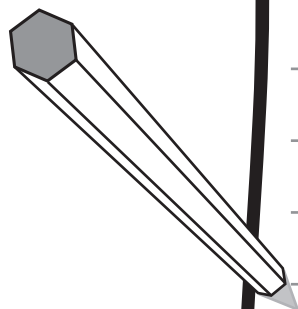
## 2000 in a telephone number!

Adding to make the next ten, the next hundred or the next thousand is an incredibly useful skill in mental mathematical fluency. Basically, if your child can find the matching number to make 1000, this stands them in excellent stead as they progress in mathematics!

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My mobile number is 07801 324 649. The last 3 digits are 649.



$$649 + 351 = 1000$$

Next to last 3 digits are 324

$$324 + 676 = 1000$$
