It has been great to see everyone back at school this week and to find out about all of the lovely things that children got up to over the half term break.

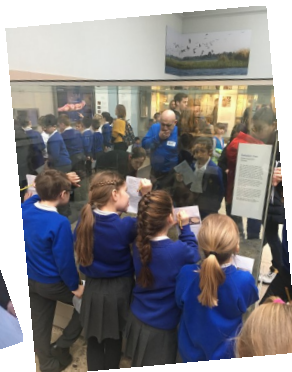
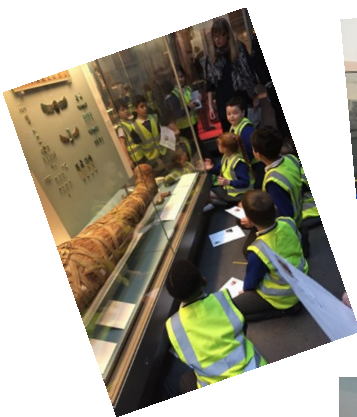

## Football Competition

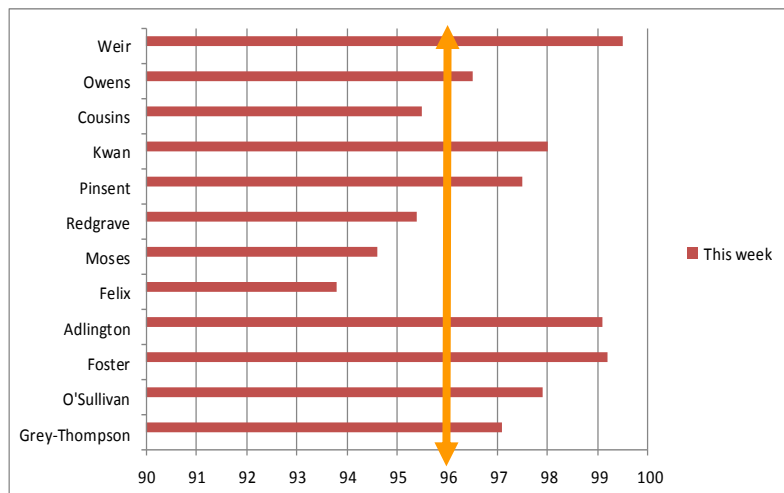
