


Year 4 Homework - Summer 1

<p><u>History:</u> Research the history of Ellingham. How has the uniform changed? Who was the first head teacher? When was the original building built? See how much you can find out and present it in an interesting way.</p> 	<p><u>Maths:</u> Collect a problem solving sheet based on measurement, money problems and time.</p> 	<p><u>Science:</u> The water cycle is essential to life on earth. Create a labelled 3D model of the water cycle.</p> 
<p><u>Geography:</u> Draw a map of the area where you live. Include as much detail as possible and use symbols to identify key features in the area - phone boxes, post boxes, churches, railway lines, bus stations etc.</p> 	<p><u>THIS ACTIVITY MUST BE COMPLETED</u> <u>English:</u> Each Friday you will be given a reading comprehension to do at home. They must be returned by Thursday each week as we will go through them in class.</p>	<p><u>Music:</u> Write a non-chronological report about the Beatles. Who were the Beatles? What did they do? Why did people like them?</p> 
<p><u>Art/Topic:</u> For our art topic we are going to be making a poster about Kingston in the style of the infamous Frank Pick underground posters. Design your own poster for another town - for example Wimbledon or Chessington.</p> 	<p><u>RE:</u> Design a poster to explain what the five pillars of Islam are.</p> 	<p><u>French:</u> French is one of the most widely spoken languages in the world. On a world map, mark all the countries where French is an official language.</p> 

Daily homework: Expectations are that children know **all** their times tables and division facts by the end of Year 4 so practise your targeted times tables (e.g. 6 times table). Also remember to **read daily** and don't forget to read a range of different texts e.g. newspapers, brochures. Continue to practice your spellings for tests every week.
