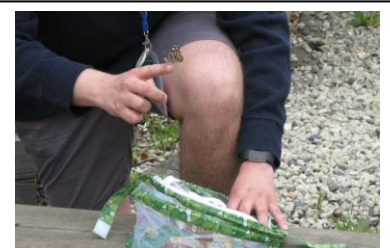
There are still places left for parents and carers interested in attending the reading workshop
