This week we have been focusing on the number 10 as it is one of the most important numbers, and forms the foundation for our learning about tens and ones.



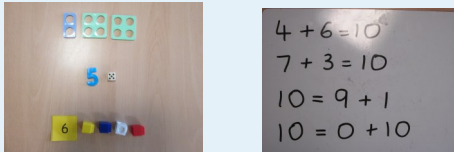
Writing skill of the week:
