It will have to be waterproof and strong enough to last! Along with the PDF ideas, you will need to choose objects that mean something to you and are important in your life. Also, your objects will have to be made from a material which will last a long time.

For example: I would like to put my phone into a time capsule. It has really helped me during this time as I write a list on it every day of things I need to do. This has helped me to stay focused and positive each day.

I would also like to put in my giraffe cuddly toy as it has given me comfort over the past few weeks.
